The session will feature Dorothy Mayne, the assistant director of UW-Madison's African Studies Program, Mary Beth Collins, the executive director of the Center for Community and Nonprofit Studies ("CommNS"), and former YALI Mandela Fellows.

The Mandela Washington Fellowship, the flagship program of the Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI), empowers young African leaders through academic coursework, leadership training, mentoring, networking, professional opportunities, and local community engagement. Since 2014, through the Mandela Washington Fellowship, the U.S. Department of State has supported nearly 4,400 young leaders from across Sub-Saharan Africa to develop their leadership skills and foster connections and collaboration with U.S. professionals. UW-Madison has hosted the program every summer since 2016 and has a network of 100 program alumni who work in areas like public health, youth development, media, law, and environmental protection across Sub-Saharan Africa.
